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## **MECHANIC – FIRE DISTRICT**

### **DEFINITION**

Maintain, service, and repair Elko County Fire Protection District vehicles, equipment, and fire apparatus. Responsible for the maintenance of tires and performing metal fabrication work.

### **SUPERVISION RECEIVED AND EXERCISED**

Receives direct supervision from the Lead Mechanic and general supervision from the Fire Administrator.

### **REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES**

*The following duties are typical for this position. Incumbents may not perform all of the listed duties and/or may be required to perform additional or different duties from those set forth below to address business needs and changing business practices.*

- Performs diagnostics, preventive maintenance, and repairs on a wide variety of department vehicles, equipment, and fire apparatus. Maintains communications with clients on repair status.
- Maintains and repairs tires.
- Performs basic fabrication, welding, and modification of parts.
- Operates general shop equipment including gas and arc welding equipment, engine analyzers, tire equipment, scanners and computers; complies with and helps enforce shop safety rules.
- Maintains proper safety and health conditions in work area. Adheres to safety rules and regulations.
- Maintains records of work performed and materials used.
- Operates equipment and drives department vehicles, trucks and equipment as required; tests and/or regularly operates vehicles and equipment.
- Complies with Elko County and department policies and procedures.
- Communicates tactfully, both verbally and in writing, with staff and the public.
- Demonstrates regular, reliable, and punctual attendance.

- Represents the County with dignity, integrity, and a spirit of cooperation in all relationships with staff and the public.

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

### KNOWLEDGE OF:

- Methods, techniques, parts, tools and materials used in the maintenance and repair of light vehicles, equipment, and fire apparatus.
- Operation and maintenance of a wide variety of hand, power and shop tools and equipment common to the field.
- Tire repair practices and procedure.
- Welding and fabrication practices and procedures.
- Pumps and pump repairs.
- Basic mathematics.
- Record keeping practices.
- Computer applications related to the work.
- Safe work methods and safety regulations pertaining to the work.
- Proper use, storage and disposal of hazardous materials.

### ABILITY TO:

- Understand and follow oral and written directions and instructions.
- Diagnose and repair a wide variety of vehicles and equipment.
- Safely operate and maintain and a variety of hand, power, and shop tools, and equipment used in the course of work.
- Document the condition of equipment and service performed in computer based maintenance program.
- Work independently in a field environment, occasionally during emergency conditions, using independent judgement within established procedural guidelines.
- Repair and replace tires using air operated equipment.
- Estimate necessary materials needed to complete tasks.

- Read and understand automotive and equipment manuals and schematics, including electrical and hydraulic.
- Perform metal fabrication work as needed
- Contribute effectively to the accomplishment of team or department goals, objectives and activities.
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with those encountered in the course of work.

### **EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE**

Successful completion of an accredited program in vehicle repair and maintenance; AND two (2) years of experience in the repair of vehicles and heavy equipment; OR an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.

### **LICENSES AND CERTIFICATIONS**

Continued employment is contingent upon all required licenses and certificates being maintained in an active status without suspension or revocation.
