

Jarbidge Advisory Board Meeting July 3<sup>rd</sup> 2020

1. Meeting called to order 8:00
2. Pledge of allegiance
3. Road report; Darren Skelton has bladed the roads, rain has created potholes again due to heavy traffic. Darren has also spoke with Terry Lister to get a loader with an attachment to mow brush and small branches back from roadway. Mag has been applied to the road through town.
4. Public works report; Justin Gilliam says all is going well with no major breakdowns with the water treatment plant. A tank mixer has been replaced and Jim Kerr is going to try to get more power routed to the tanks so that the mixers can be run simultaneously. As for the trash, we have not heard back from anyone about the construction dumpster that was brought up with Jim Kerr in last year's advisory board meeting. There are still people putting green waste, large metal items, construction debris etc. into the trash dumpster. The mention of game cameras came up again to try to catch the people responsible for placing these items into the trash dumpster so that they can pay extra, or remove the items and haul them off to a proper facility. The Jarbidge Advisory Board would like to receive confirmation about getting a construction dumpster here in Jarbidge.
5. Jarbidge Jail; Brock and Cindy Wilmarth have volunteered to be the caretakers of the Jarbidge Jail. The Jarbidge Advisory Board would like confirmation on The Wilmarths being the caretakers of the Jarbidge jail. They have already hired a licensed electrician to repair the electrical at the jail which they were reimbursed for however, we have not heard how much money is left in the jail fund for future repairs and if the funding is ongoing. The Jarbidge advisory board would like to request this information.
6. Jarbidge public toilet; it has been discussed at the meeting about a public toilet in Pioneer Park or on the fire station property next to the Jarbidge Community Hall for the tourists to use. The suggestions were getting a quote from the people that make the one piece units that the Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management use, or having one built on site. Either way the Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management have a company that comes in and pumps out their units periodically that can be used to pump the new toilet in Jarbidge or tie it into the fire station's septic tank if it is placed on that property. The Jarbidge Advisory Board would like to have confirmation about getting a public toilet installed here in Jarbidge.
